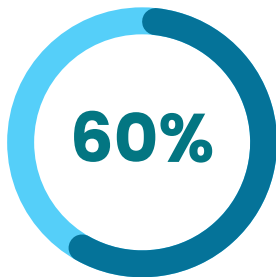


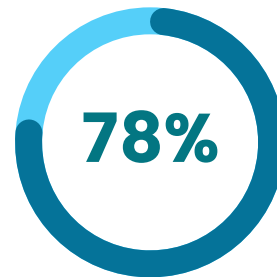
In October 2024, The DeBruce Foundation partnered with American Student Assistance to use their TeenVoice platform to survey 600 youth ages 13-19 from across the country.

## Students feel confident...

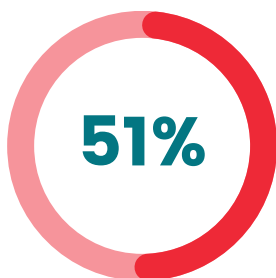


6 out of 10 teens are thinking about or know their future career.

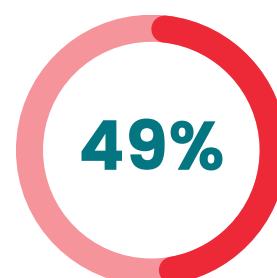


Nearly 8 out of 10 teens report some level of confidence about their career choice.

## ...but evidence shows that many youth still need support in developing Career Literacy



51% are considering 2 or fewer careers, despite the Bureau of Labor Statistics finding that the average person will have 12 different jobs in their lifetime.



49% have little to no idea about how to prepare for a career, lacking the tools or the opportunities to do so.
